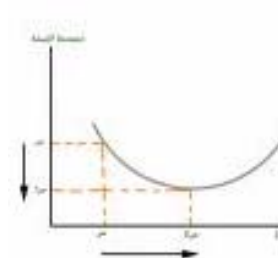

SI Drivers

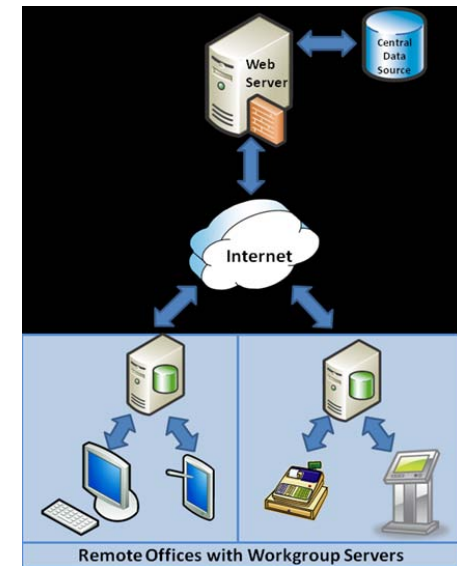
- Security/Safety Needs

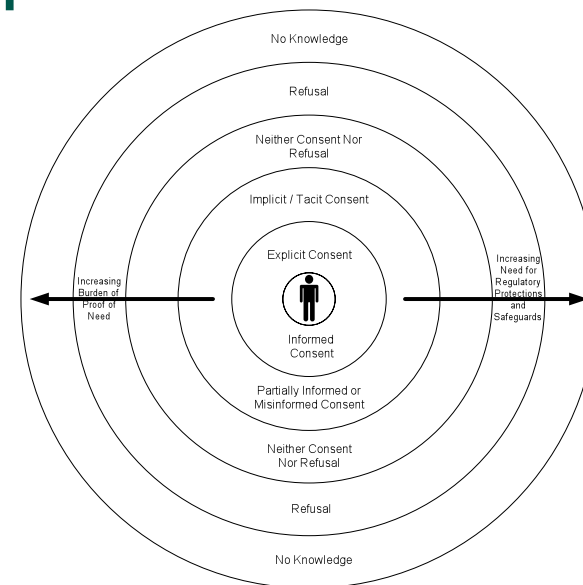
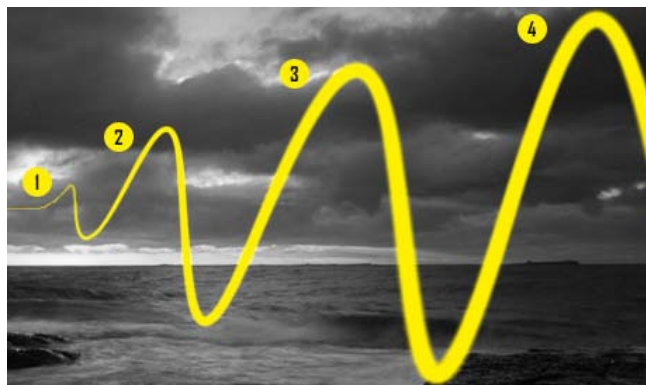
