

## Scope of Workshop

### Session I: International Data Sharing

The scope of this session is to discuss the challenges in existing international regulations with regard to sharing of personal data:

- Are free flow of information and protection of personal information contradictory goals?
- Who is to benefit from international data sharing?
- Whose responsibility is it to protect personal data in relation to data sharing across borders?

### Session II: Privacy vis-à-vis Security

*The Scope of session II is to discuss the challenges in terms of cultural differences in perceptions of privacy, security and surveillance specifically in relation to PETs and personal detection technologies:*

- *Why is privacy valued?*
- *Are all types of privacy to be equally valued?*
- *What type of privacy is to be protected and, from whom, from what, and by what means?*
- *Is there an inevitable conflict between privacy and security?*

### Session III: Is there a right to have an Identity?

*The scope of session III is to discuss what it means to have an identity as well as the dual use potentials of biometrics and personal detection technologies:*

- *To what extent is identity related to body image?*
- *How are ethnicity and personal identity related?*
- *How do issues of national security and personal security interrelate?*
- *What role does identity tracking play in the protection of personal identity?*

### Session IV: Personal data and the Human Body: Rights and ethics

- *How can different types of privacy and the differences in values of privacy be reflected in an international privacy framework on data sharing?*
- *Does personal data related to the body (by use of biometrics) differ from other types of personal data with regard to data protection and international data sharing?*
